## 2. Presentation from Apple:

Presentation took place on behalf of Apple by Stuart Anderson Senior Technical Consultant (SA), and Gillian Penny Education Business Development Manager (GP). GP stated that questions regarding navigating Apple for support and advice may be directed via herself going forward. A discussion then took place- questions and answers are laid out below

### 3. Information Security Update and discussion

CSu, InfoSec CISO updated on the work of the InfoSec Service and then gave a more general outline of the landscape.

#### InfoSec Update

- Six Universities, Five Colleges and APUC now members, with one more institution looking to join shortly
- Business Impact Assessments have been taking place, can be challenging to co-ordinate suitable time with required stakeholders- CS keen to ensure institutions fully benefit from membership, this initial engagement key
- In meetings with Executives the key message that InfoSec is a business issue has been well received
- 1 part-time resource has been identified as new member of InfoSec team, brings solid technical skills and is a widely regarded InfoSec expert
- InfoSec looking to meet Scottish Government to assess their offer to InfoSec to share Security Operation Centre. The Chair asked for further details- **CSu stated he would feed back when details known**
- Suggested that InfoSec update become a standing item at HEIDS. CSu welcomed this and suggested he add mini-topics that would be of interest to the group.

#### General Security Update

- Latest DDoS attacks appear to have learned from recent Janet attack- demonstrating the agility and intelligence of attackers
- CSu asked that if anyone comes across instances of students being targeted with Phishing or similar scams to share with Chris so Sector as a whole can learn from experience of other institutions. **HEIDS members encouraged to share intelligence on threats/incidents with CSu going forward to enable Sector to learn from each other**

- CSu liaising with Scottish Secretaries Group in February for a general overview of what they should be aware of in this area: explaining who “risk owners” are and explaining terminology. If particular areas that HEIDS members believe should be highlighted/included in this presentation, please let CSu know
- **HEIDS to add Information Security as a standing item to future HEIDS Agenda including Current Threats and Landscape, plus InfoSec service**

#### 4. Roundtable Discussion

The un-minuted round-table discussion on projects, hot topics and areas of interest for each institution took place.

#### 5. Reports from Other Groups

##### 5.1 SFC (DB)

- Capital Funding Strategy is being drawn up, with an outline due to go to the Board in December. DB requested that HEIDS provide input to make case for important areas. HEIDS representatives asked to send top themes and spending anticipated over next 3 to 5 years. **ACTION OF to collate input.** (It was observed by members that Cap Ex to Op Ex has altered the investment landscape in IT recently)
- International Strategy. Rapidly changing landscape at present. SFC keen to increase positive impacts of internationalisation. Jisc continue to support internationalisation via Janet.
- Enterprise and skills review- now in phase 2. Recent report recommending joint governance is still being digested

##### 5.2 Universities Scotland (DW)

- Spending review has been subject to more engagement. December likely date for announcement of budget. Government increasingly recognises Higher Education as an engine of economic growth. Examples of eye catching initiatives that demonstrate wide economic impact would be welcomed.
- Efficiency task force may have a look at implications of Brexit. **Any thoughts from members should be channelled through BH.**
- Apprentice levy situation still awaiting clarity as to what support may be available
- USET meeting at the end of November. OF and BH are collecting information on Shared Services in place across sector.
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##### 5.3 Jisc

- Network upgrades taking place to keep up with increasing requirements
- Security mitigation- update will be given when available



- Work with University of Edinburgh taking place to support requirements for Higgs centre.
- National Library of Scotland being connected to the JANET network.
- Continuing work with fibre providers to address SLAs being missed, and communication of work being poorly handled. Scottish JANET Users Group to be set up by JMC to discuss/shape what institutions require from Jisc, and how Jisc can continue to improve.
- Updates given on Effective Analytics and Research Data Shared Service.
- Trans National Education- JMC called for institutions to share upcoming international projects to ensure that needs and capacity forecasted.
- Business Intelligence work- further details available online- <https://www.jisc.ac.uk/rd/projects/business-intelligence-project>
- Jisc restructure with an aim to move to membership model, make take up of services easy as possible to track and take-up. Some questions were asked around membership model and whether core services would become opt-in. JMC stated that unclear as to details of model at present
- Penny Robertson now moved on, Jason acting as Account Manager for institutions that Penny served previously.
- JM-C offered to present to Senior Management Team as to role of Jisc if this would be useful to institutions

#### **5.4 SCURL/SCONUL (BH)**

**ACTION: BH will share meeting notes from SCURL meeting.** BH met the chair of SCURL. LMS uptake has been less than expected, perhaps due to institutions considering open source alternatives going forward. Looking to leverage E-book agreement. Physical collections being considered for group agreement and sharing.

#### **5.5 UCISA (PT + AM)**

PT and AM had sent apologies in advance of the meeting

#### **5.6 APUC (MMcL)**

- SRS Tender- GCU acting as vanguard institution for agreement that will be open to other institutions. MJ of GCU stated that he would like to ensure that other institutions find the new agreement beneficial- and asked for volunteer from another institution to feed into the tender, and to help evaluate the replies. DJ and CJ offered help here. JM stated that UCISA has been collecting information on core systems such as SRS- may have useful information/guidance.
- VLE system tender going out shortly, expected to be in place end of January 2017.
- Currency fluctuations leading to some suppliers looking to raise prices.
- Mobile desktop client- HP looking to provide 2 choices,
- National Servers and Storage agreement being replaced by Server Storage Solutions National Agreement, includes High Performance Computing.
- MS contract due in in 1<sup>st</sup> half of December. ACTION MMcL to check pricing information when available.
- MJ raised a question regarding new Microsoft PCs- belief is that one will have to decide when purchasing to specify whether one wants Windows 7 or Windows 10

### **5.7 FE/HE ICT Sector Oversight Board (DB)**

- Digital Skills continues to be major focus.
- Scottish Government considering whether to mandate that online use of services where possible. AW volunteered to join the Digital Services Working Group looking at this issue.
- ISSC has been granted a no cost extension meaning it continue run past original timescale of 2017.
- Jisc funding an area of discussion- make up of funding (institutional and/or central) being discussed.
- Vice Chair asked about implications of procurement law and Jisc funding- **ACTION JM-C stated that he will ask Jisc legal to provide clarity on this.**

### **5.8 UCSS IS Catalyst (OF)**

- OF had provided a written update prior to meeting
- OF updated the group on the status of existing and candidate shared service and noted that Helpdesk had been mentioned by a number of people earlier in the day as an area of renewed interest

## **6. AOCB**

- Future areas of interest were discussed. The Chair stated that Simon Marsden's input regarding an item on Core System strategy was a promising area to consider. Ethics recording was mentioned of area with interest.
- It was noted that a number of suppliers have asked to present at future meetings. The group was keen to ensure that future presentations impart knowledge and intelligence, and is not a platform for sales pitches. The Secretary stated he will share info on proposed presentations that may be of interest to get the feedback of the further group.
- The Chair noted that Alastair Fenemore had offered to lead on the HEIDS Security Group **ACTION OF to add Re-establish of HEIDS Security Subgroup to the action tracker?**
- CJ requested aid with upcoming project that requires a systems architect with sector experience that other representatives could recommend, or volunteer resource to help.
- No further items were raised by the group.

The chair thanked the University of Dundee for hosting the meeting. The next meeting of HEIDS is due to take place on the 10<sup>th</sup> of February at Glasgow University
